AT THE RESTAURANT

After the children have watched a video a couple of times, they can play the parts of customers and waiters and practise the conversation. Try to arrange a table and chairs if possible.

May I take your order? (At the Restaurant) - Easy English Dialogue English Singsing

A: Hi. May I take your order?

B: Yes. I'd like a pizza and spaghetti.

A: Anything else?

C: A green salad, please.

A: A pizza, spaghetti and a green salad. Right?

A: Yes. That's right.

C: Oh, it's too hot*.

B: Do you want some water?

C: Yes, please.

A is the waiter; B and C are the customers (mother and son).

Explain that *too hot here means very spicy.

When the children do the role play, let them substitute *pizza*, *spaghetti* and *green salad* with other things.

[Order] May I take your order? Anything else? For here or to go. - English for Kids English Singsing

A: Hi. May I take your order?

B: Yes. I'd like a hamburger, French fries and a Coke.

A: Anything else?

B: No, thank you. That's it.

A: OK. For here or to go*?

B: For here, please.

A: Hi. May I take your order?

B: Yes. I'd like two cheese burgers.

A: Anything else?

B: Yes, two large Cokes, please.

A: OK. For here or to go?

B: To go, please.

Explain that *For here or to go means if you would be eating at the restaurant or getting the food packed.

At the Restaurant Conversation EverydayEnglish

Play only this part a couple of times. Let the children listen to the conversation and become familiar with the words.

Take up the following with them:

menu/starter/main course/dessert/bill

You could make them repeat some of the sentences:

I would like a table for two.

Can I get the menu, please?

Can I get you anything to drink?

Are you ready to order?

I'd like the grilled chicken with chips and rice, please.(Can be substituted with food they are familiar with)

Later on they could practise bigger chunks of the conversation in pairs.

Part 2 of the video is at a food court. Take it up in the same way.

Ask the children to observe the differences: the way in which the orders are taken, the kind of food etc.
