

WHAT ARE YOU DOING? (1) WHAT IS HE/SHE DOING?

This lesson will teach the students to use the present continuous/progressive tense. Remember, you don't have to tell them these terms. This is just for your reference.

The children should initially be able to ask and answer:

What are **you** doing?

I **am** _____ing.

Then they can be taught:

What is he/she doing?

What are we/they doing?

She is singing.

What is Tom doing?

He is dancing.

She is singing.

He is dancing.

Singing dancing singing dancing...

What is Ann doing?

She is cooking.

What is Nick doing?

He is eating.

She is cooking.

He is eating.

Cooking eating cooking eating...

What are you doing? - Exciting song - Sing along

What are you doing?

I'm washing, washing.

What are you doing?

I'm eating, eating.

What are you doing?

I'm dancing, dancing.

I'm dancing. I'm dancing now.

What is he doing?

He's running, running.

What is he doing?

He's drawing, drawing.

What is she doing?

She's sleeping, sleeping.

She's sleeping. She's sleeping now. Shh!

In the song, the verbs are repeated:

I'm washing, **washing**

It is okay to repeat the word when the children are singing but when they practise the sentences, make them say the verb only once.

What are you doing?

I'm washing/I'm dancing/I'm eating.

buy/buying
clean/cleaning etc.

What are you doing?

I'm buying new clothes.

I'm cleaning my house.

I'm cooking a cake.

I'm drinking a soda.

I'm driving in my car.

I'm eating a hamburger.

I'm jumping.

I'm kicking the ball.

I'm listening to music.

I'm painting a picture.

I'm playing with my toys.

I'm reading a book.

I'm riding a skateboard.

I'm running in the park.

I'm singing a song.

I'm sitting on a chair.

I'm smiling.

I'm swimming in the pool.

I'm waiting for the bus.

I'm walking down the street.

Same sentences with he/she:

She is buying new clothes.

He is cleaning his house.

Children who can read and are aware of sentence structure should be asked what is missing: the full stop at the end of the sentence!

Instead of cooking a cake you can make the children say baking a cake.

Give them another sentence for *cooking*:

I am cooking food.
