Please remember you don't have to use the word *adjectives*. Just tell the children we are using different words to describe clothes.

adjective +clothes green shirt/ blue coat/ small shoes/smelly shoes tight trousers (or pants)/loose trousers (or pants)

What is he/she wearing? What are you/they wearing? I am wearing a black suit.

He is wearing a blue shirt and brown pants etc.

Let the students describe each other's clothes or look at pictures of people in newspapers and magazines and describe the clothes they wearing.
