I eat breakfast in the morning.

I do homework.

I do homework in the evening etc.

I wake up at seven o' clock in the morning.

I get dressed in the morning.

I wash my face/brush my teeth/comb my hair in the morning.

I eat breakfast at seven thirty in the morning.

I go to school at eight o' clock in the morning.

I play with my friends at nine o' clock in the morning.

I eat lunch at one o' clock in the afternoon.
I go home at three o'clock in the afternoon.
I take a nap at three thirty in the afternoon,
I play with my dog at four in the afternoon.
I swim in the afternoon.
I eat dinner at six o'clock in the evening.
I watch TV at six thirty in the evening.
I play video games at seven o'clock in the evening.
I read a book at seven thirty in the evening.
I take a bath at eight o' clock in the evening.
I dry my hair in the evening.
I sleep at nine o'clock at night etc.

You should also give them practice in using *in the morning/ in the afternoon/ at night*.
